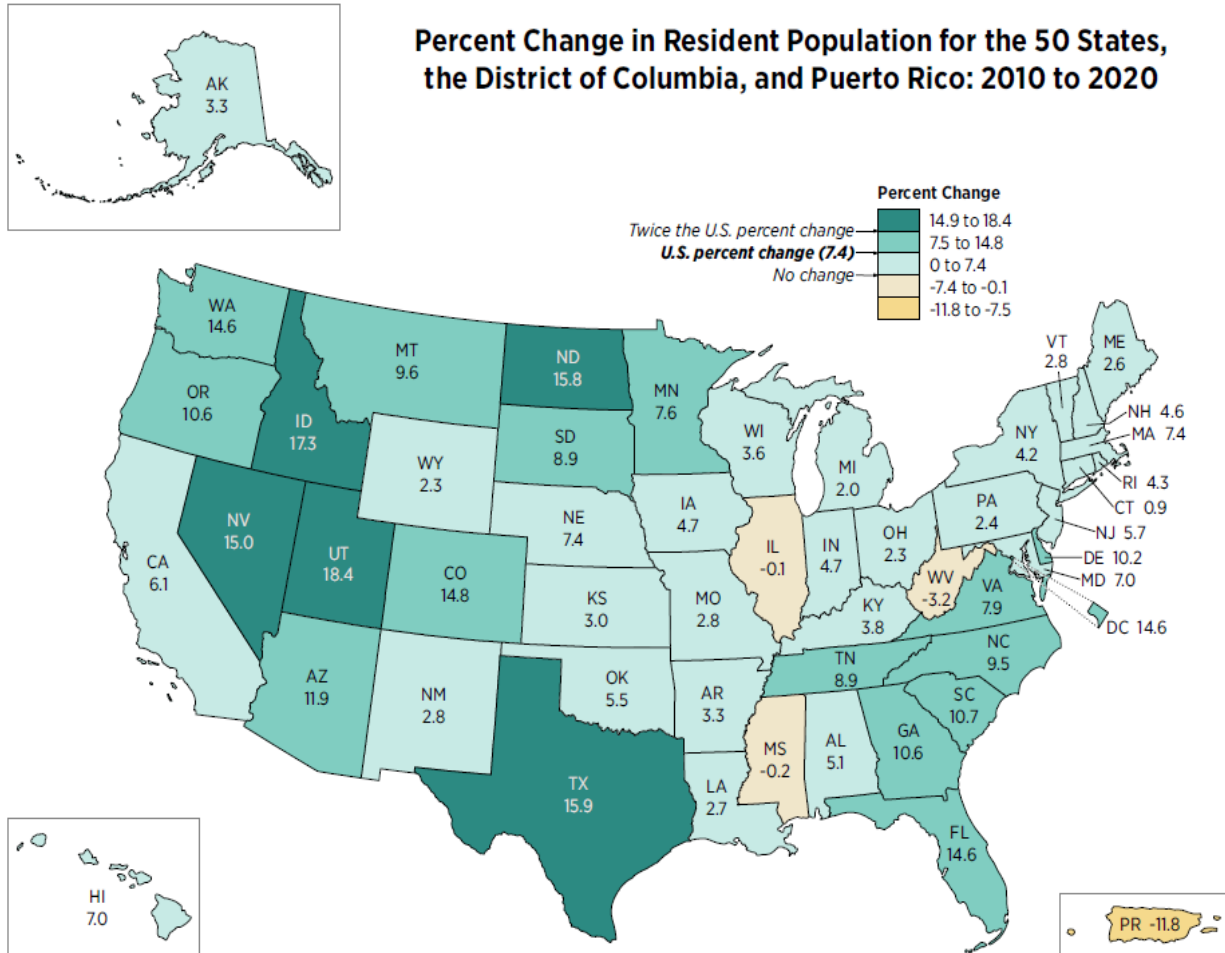




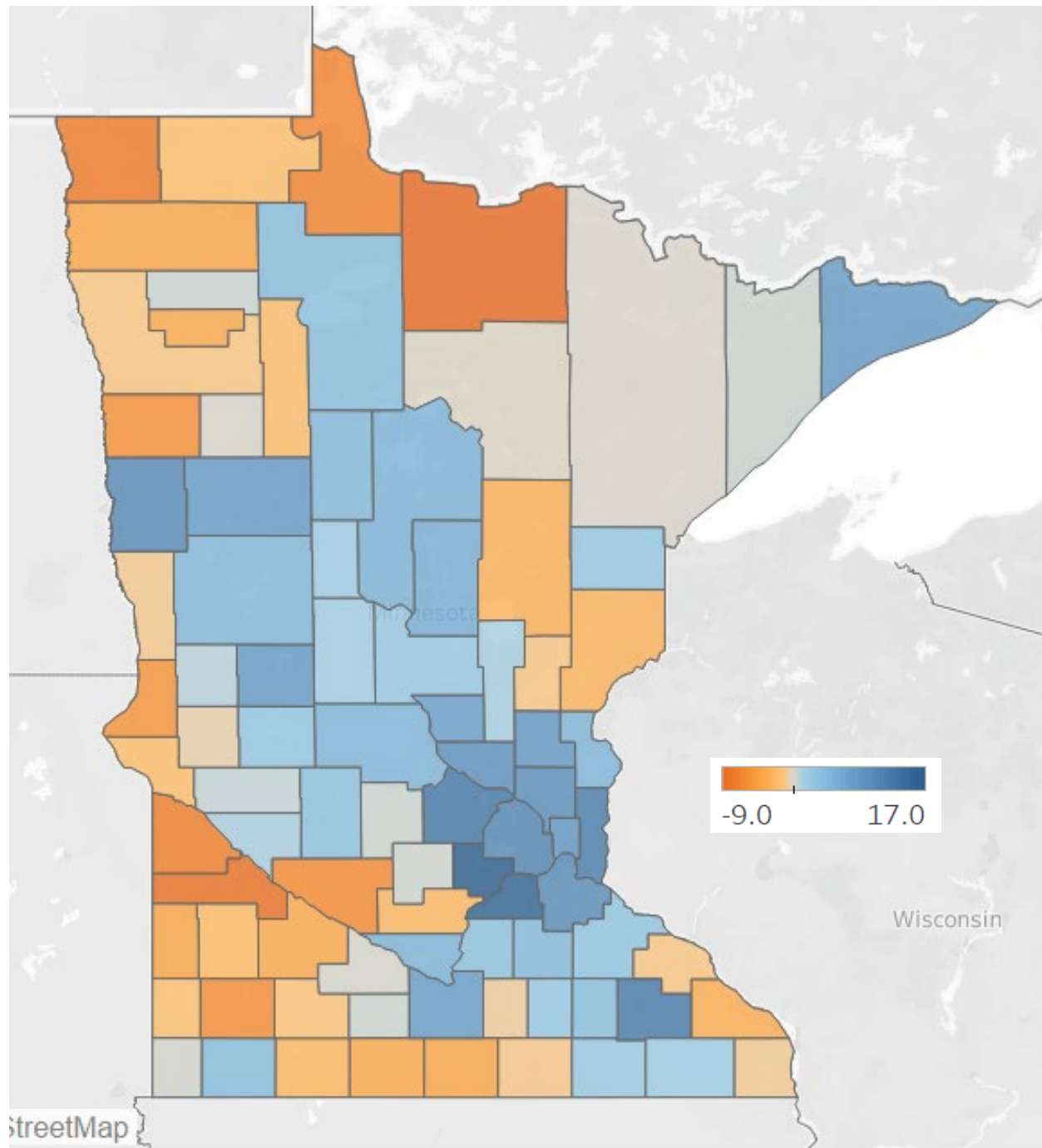
2020 Self-Response Rates

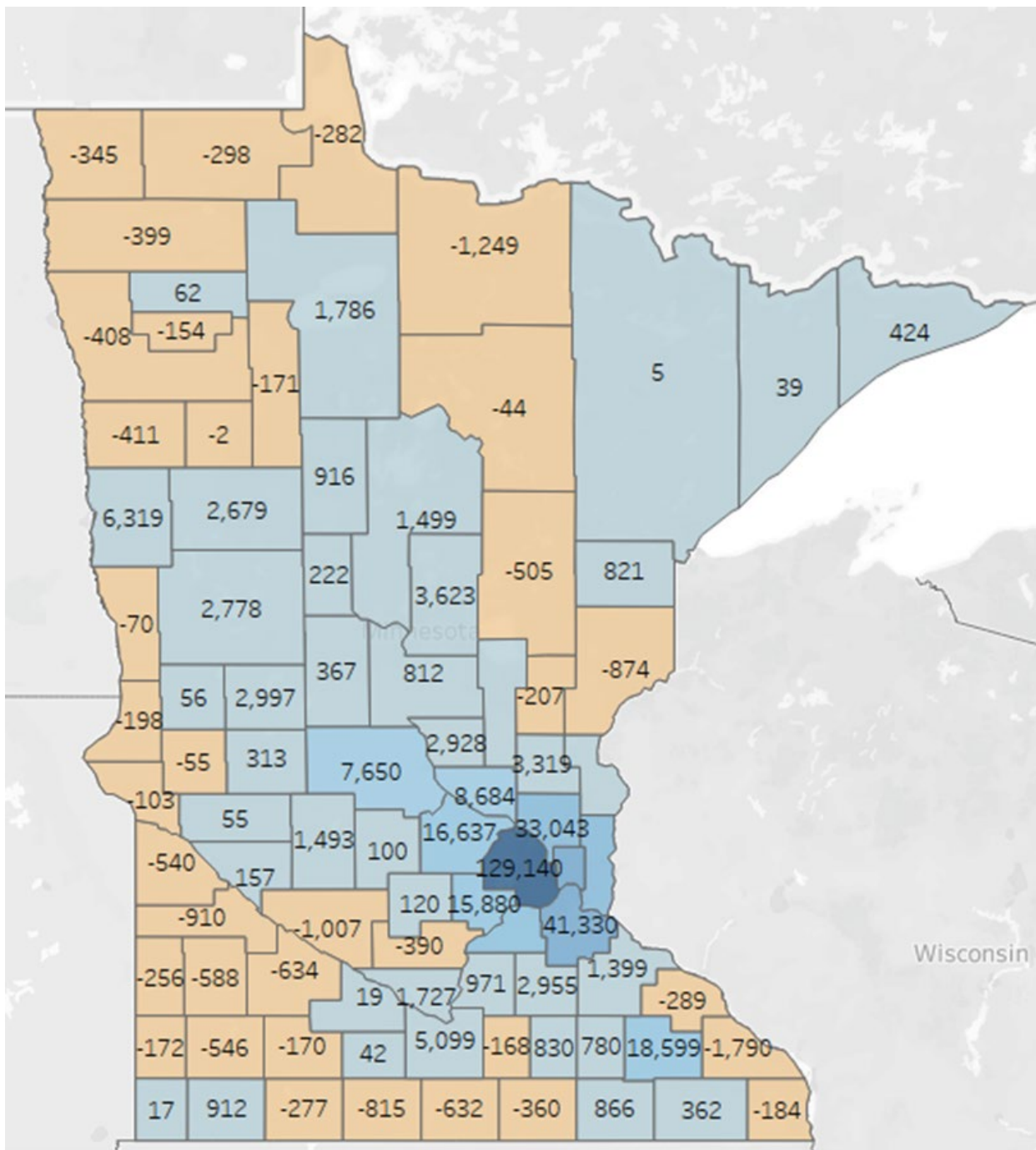

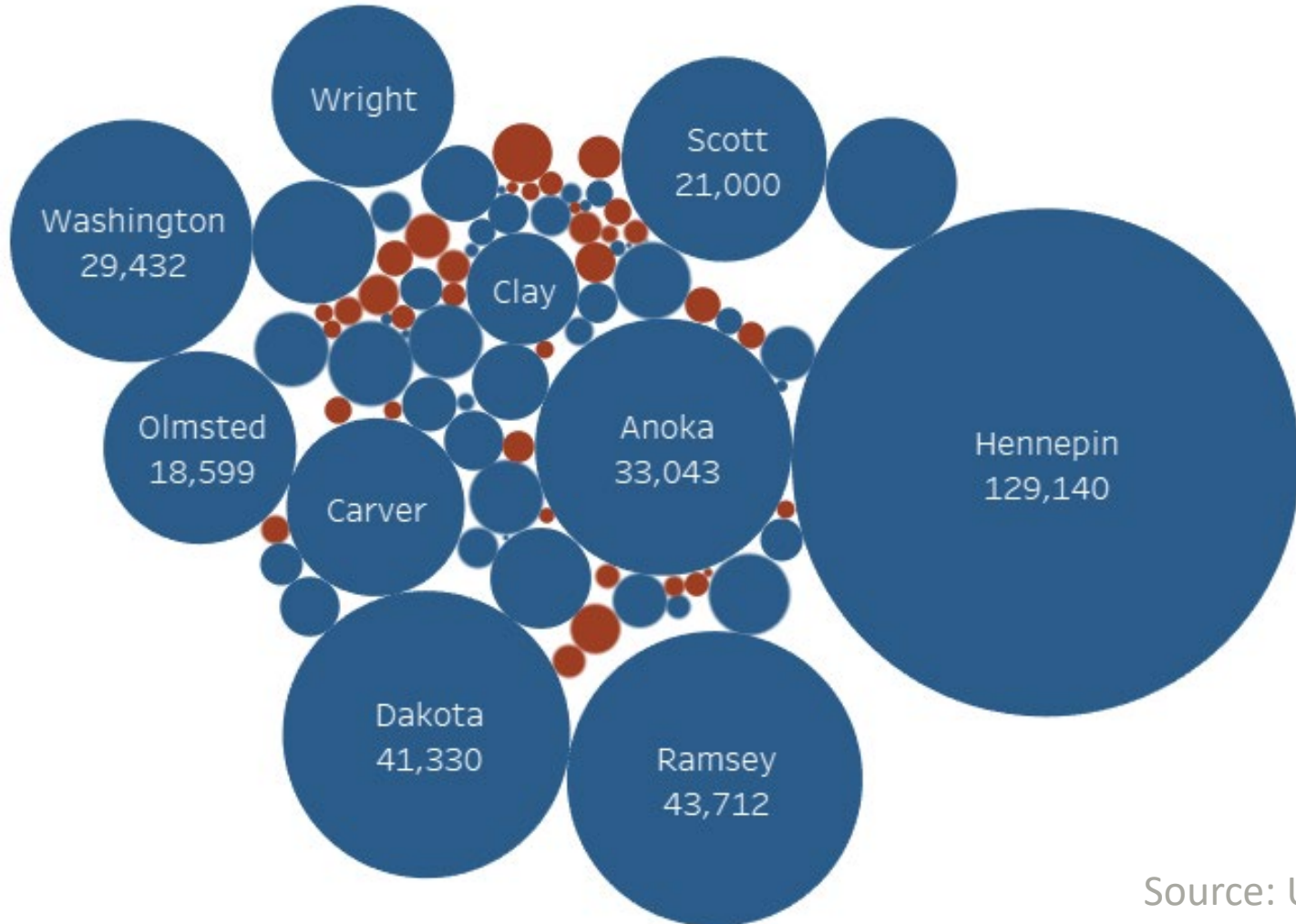

Numeric population change by county, 2010-2020

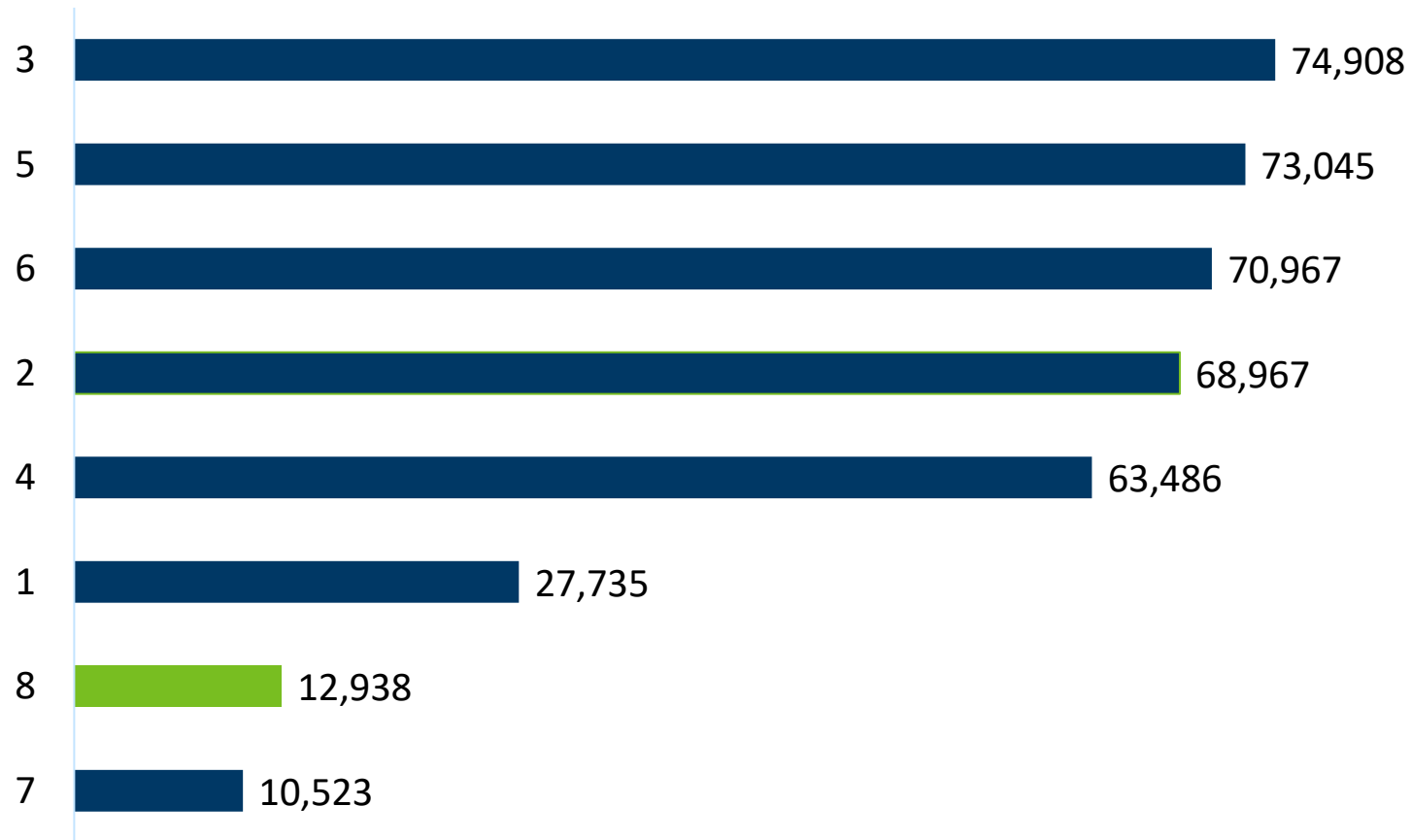


- 51 counties gained population.

Growth in Minnesota's U.S. Congressional Districts

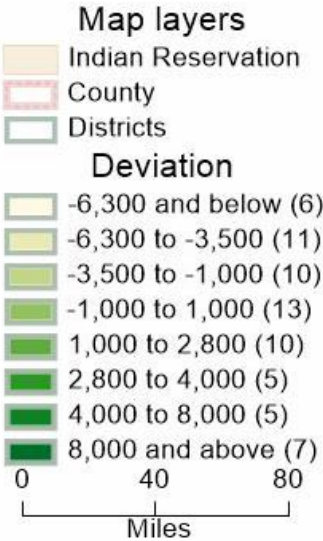
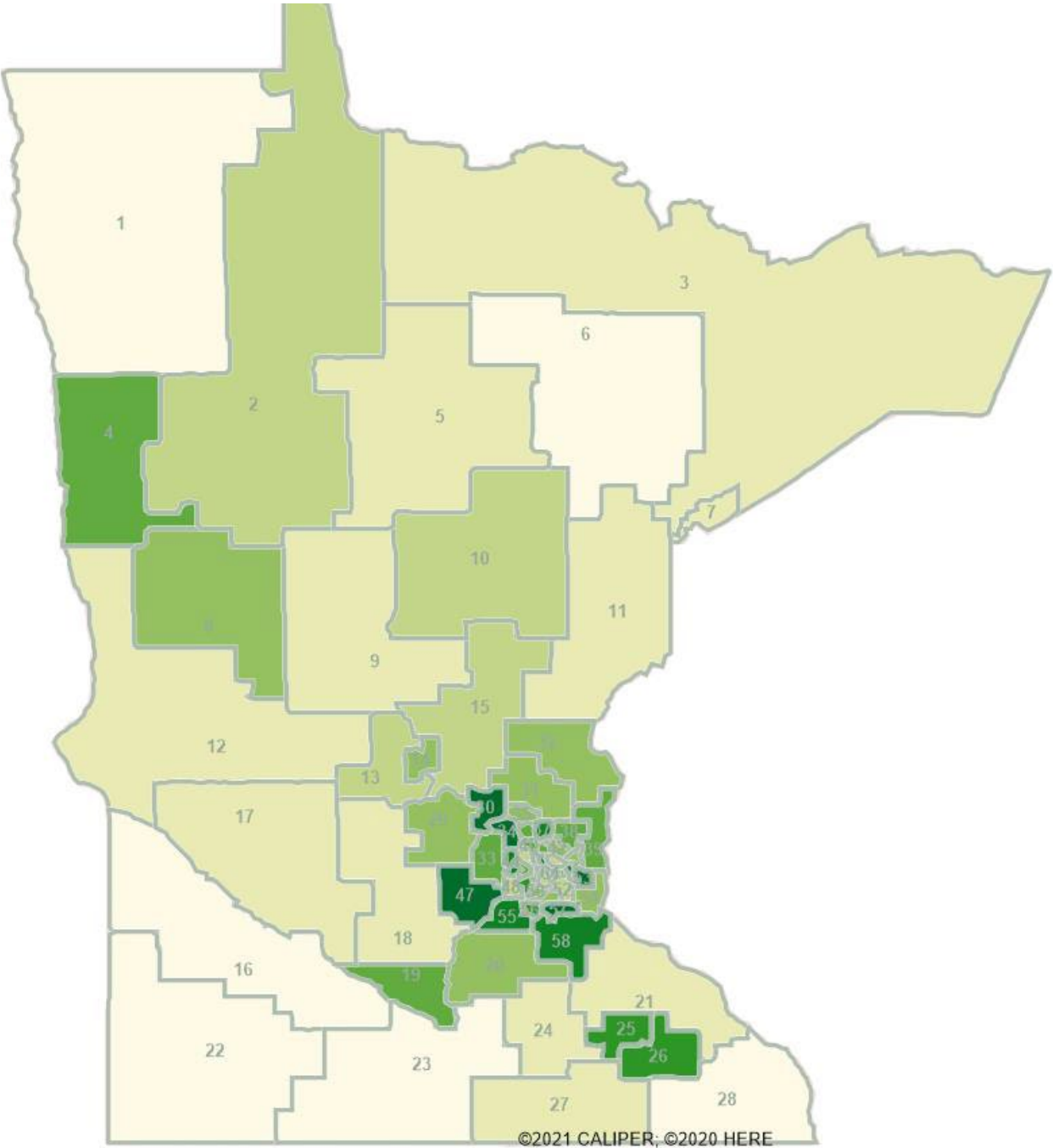
Population Change by Congressional District, 2010-2020

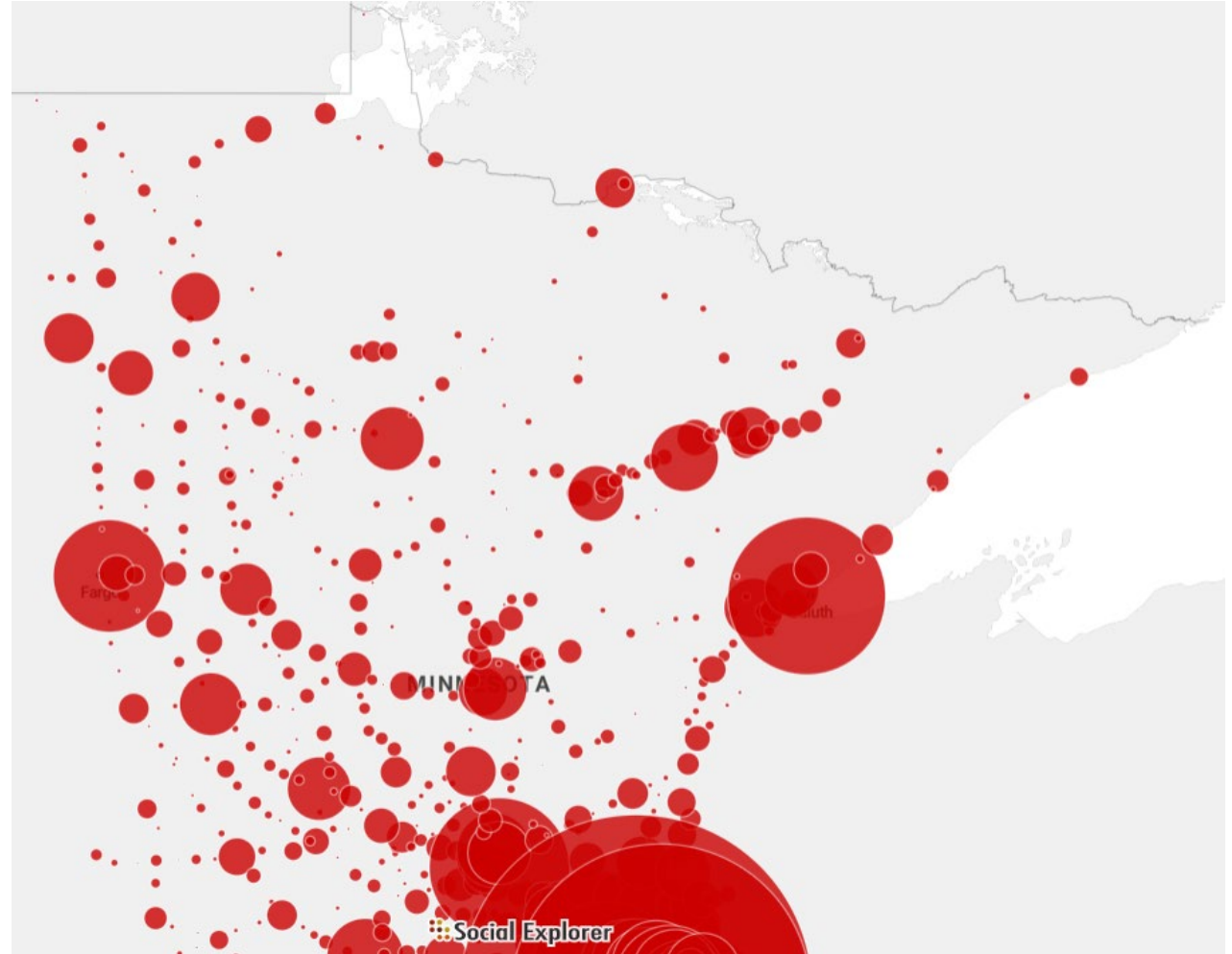
Difference from Ideal State Senate Districts



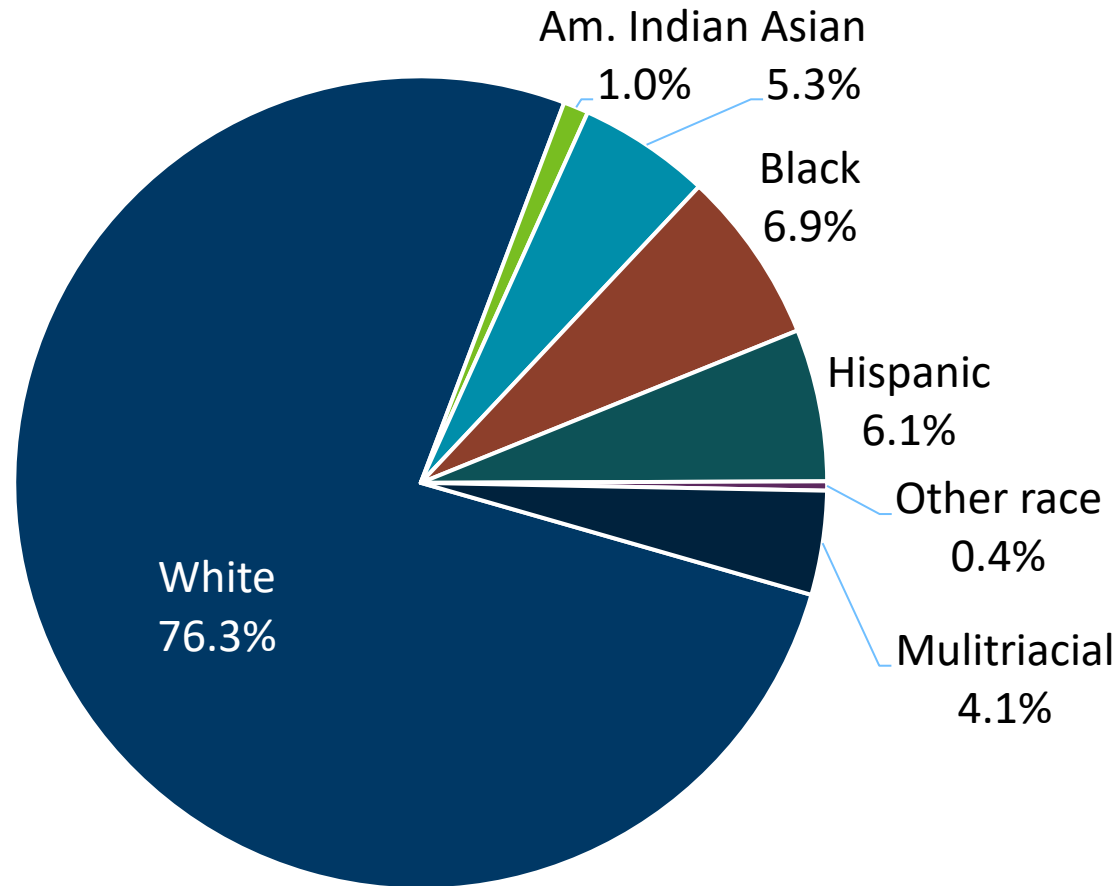

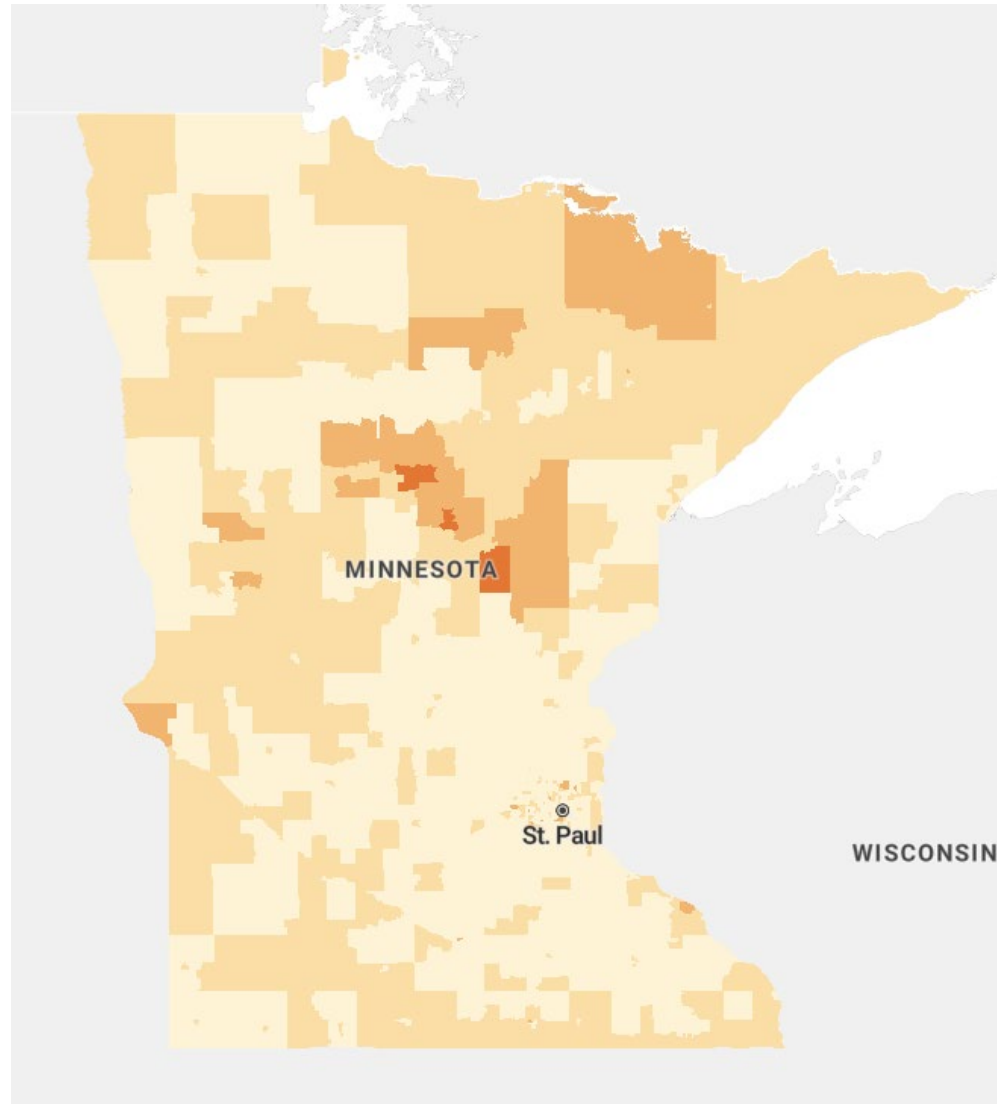

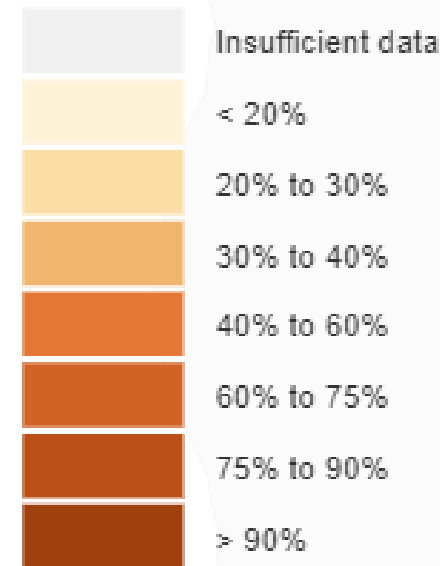


Aging and Labor Force Outlook

Northeastern Minnesota has higher-than-average shares of older adults

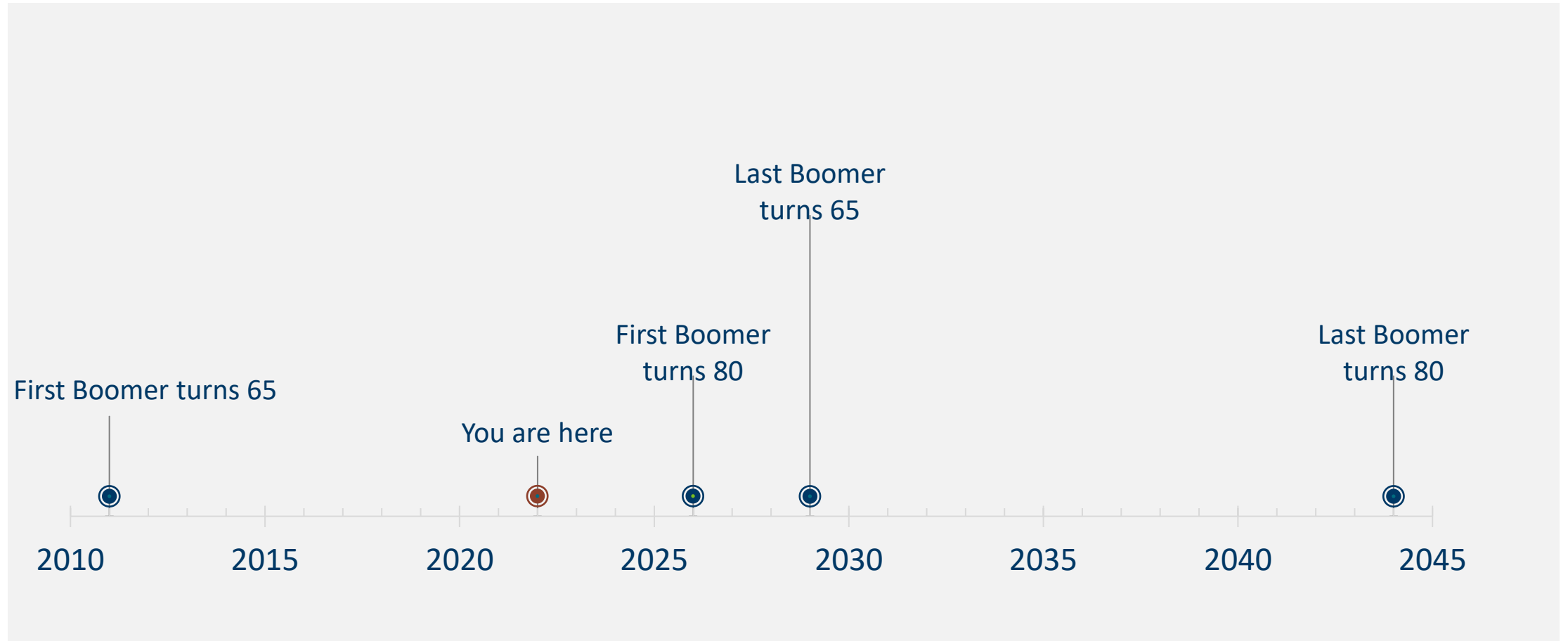

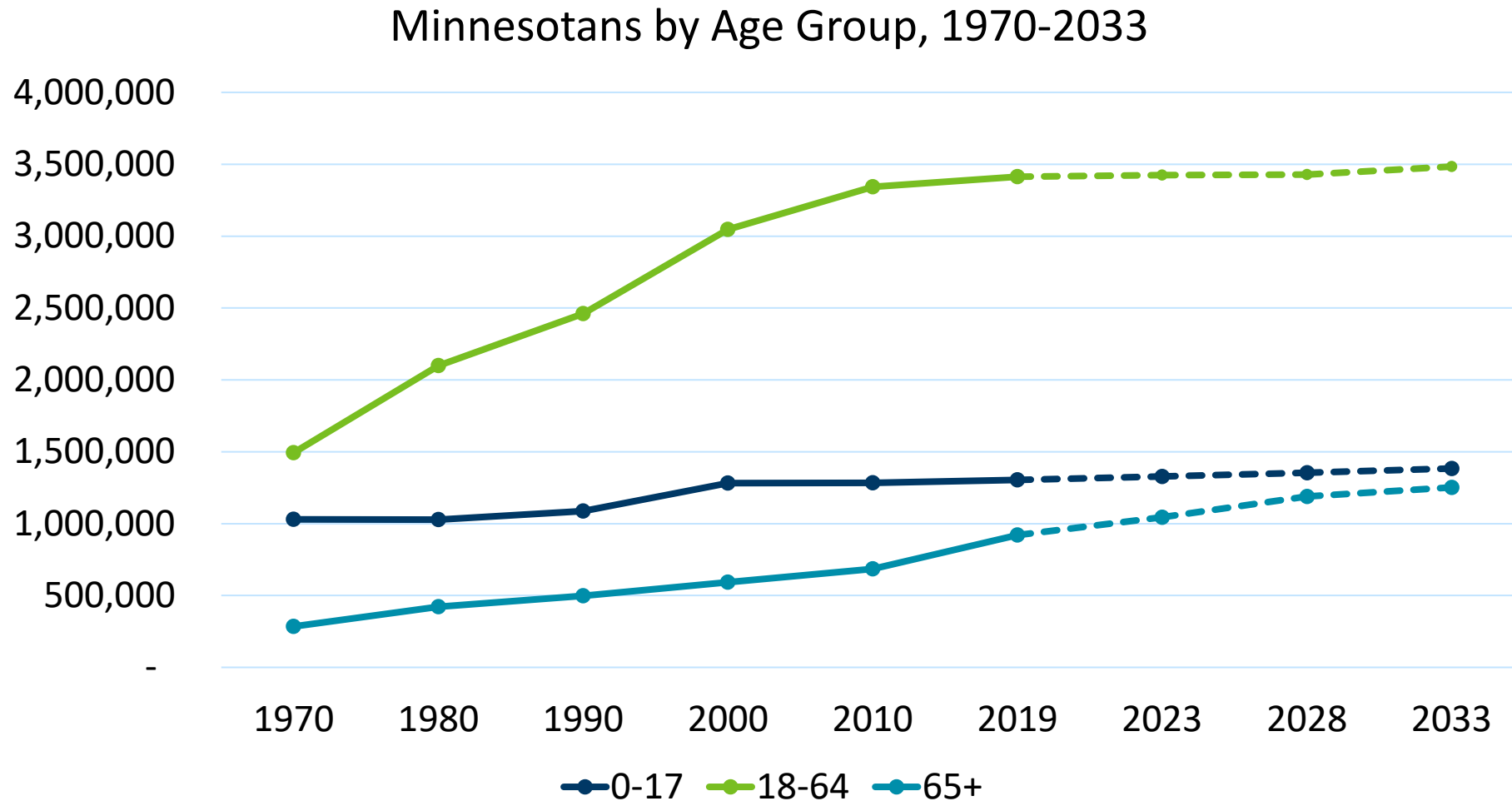

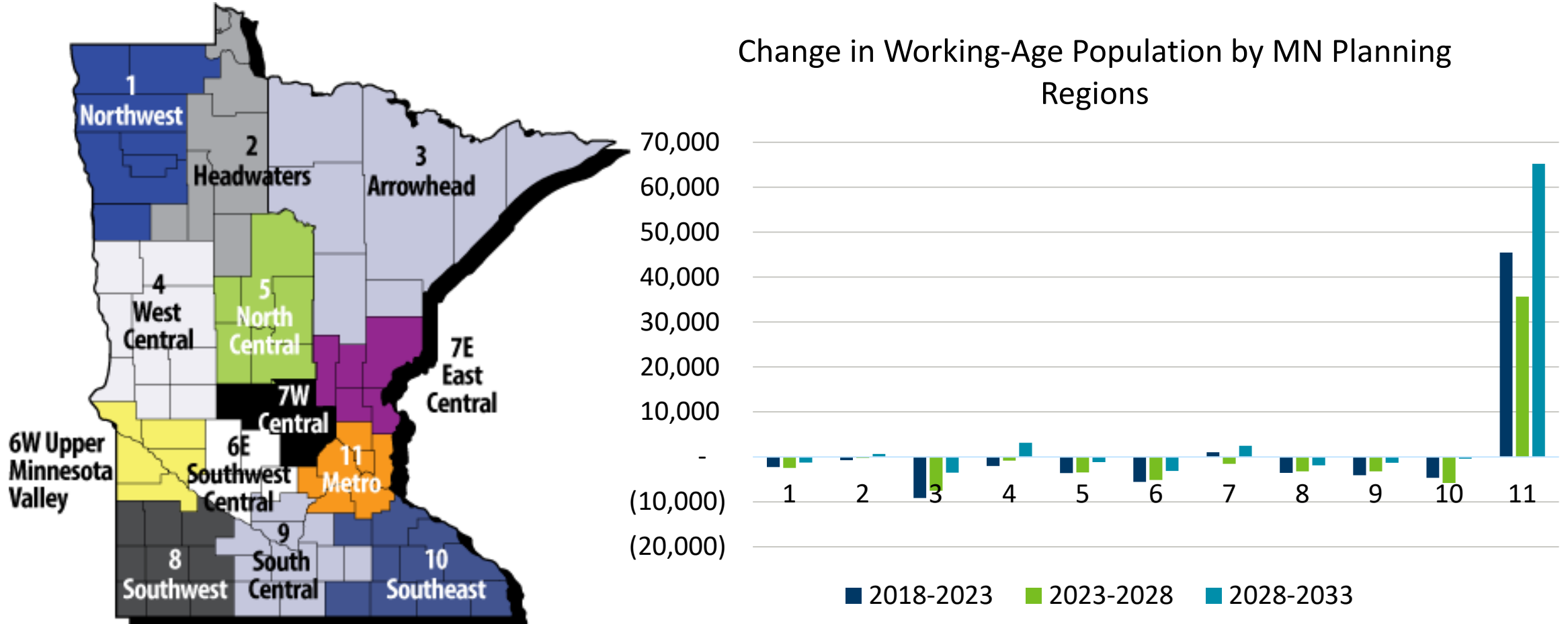
Aging Timeline



Little-to -no growth in working-age population in Minnesota over the next 15 years

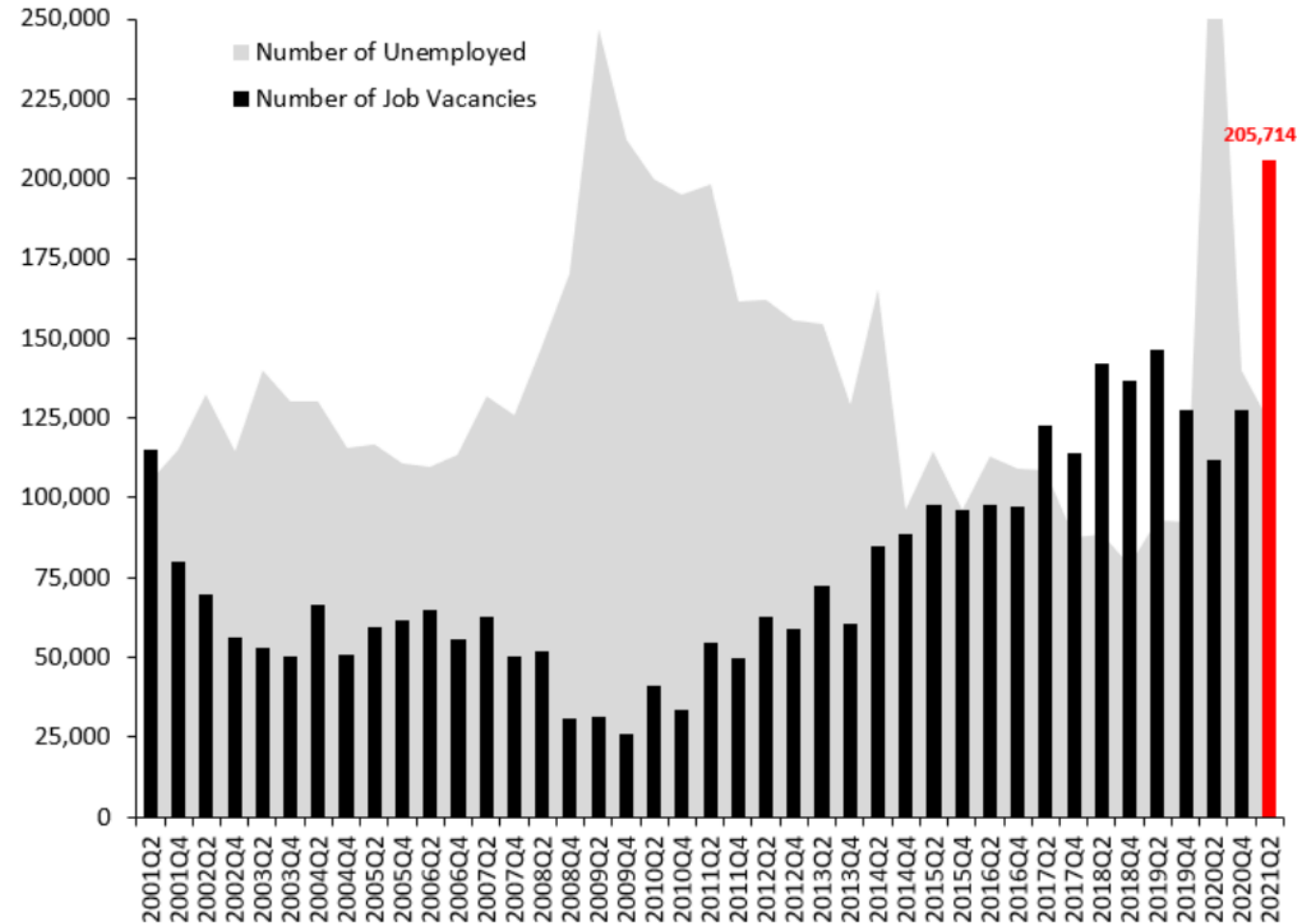


Without changes to migration in the coming years, Greater Minnesota regions will see declines in working-age population

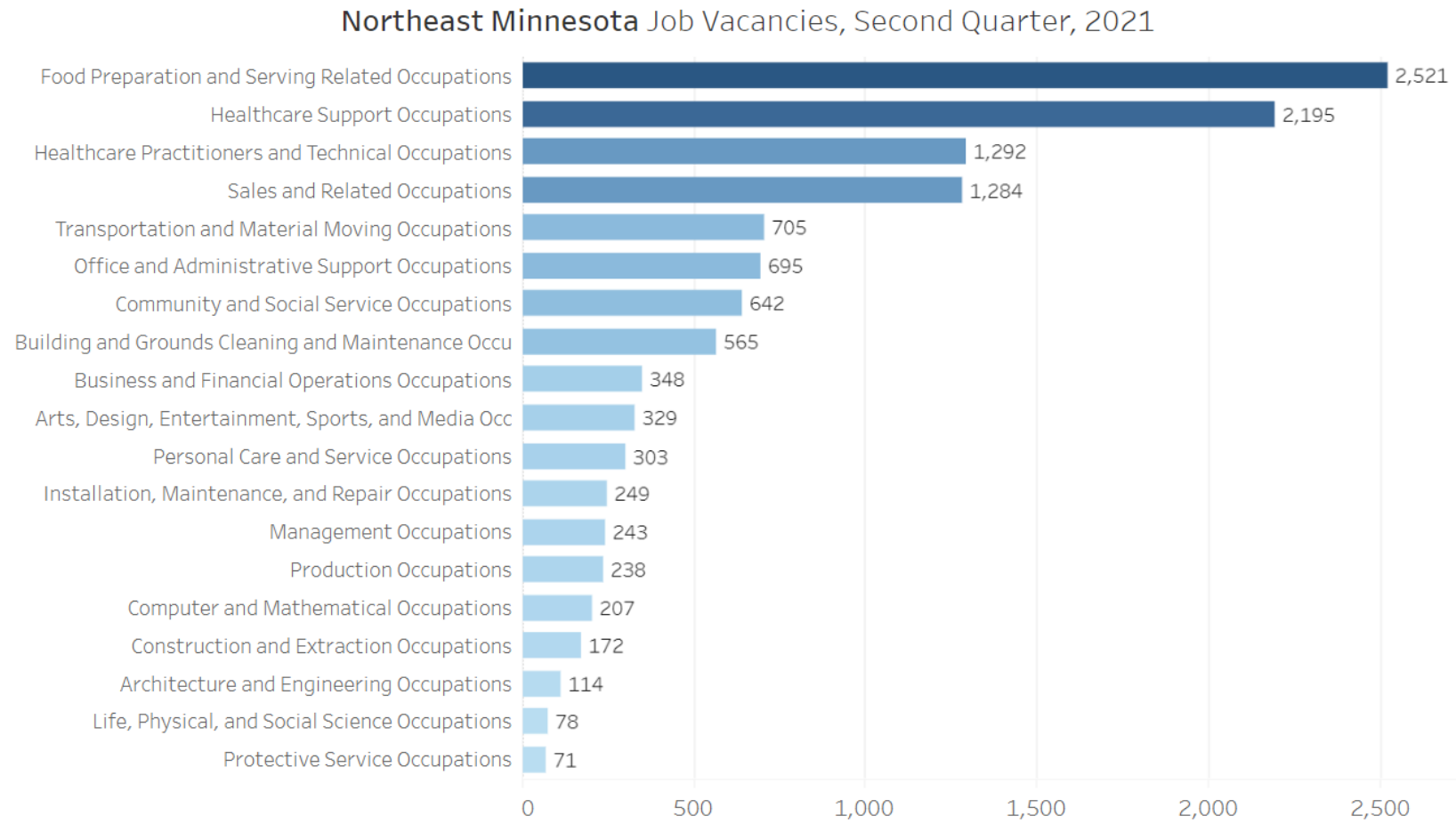


There were 206,000 job openings in Minnesota in early 2021 & 124,000 people actively looking for work

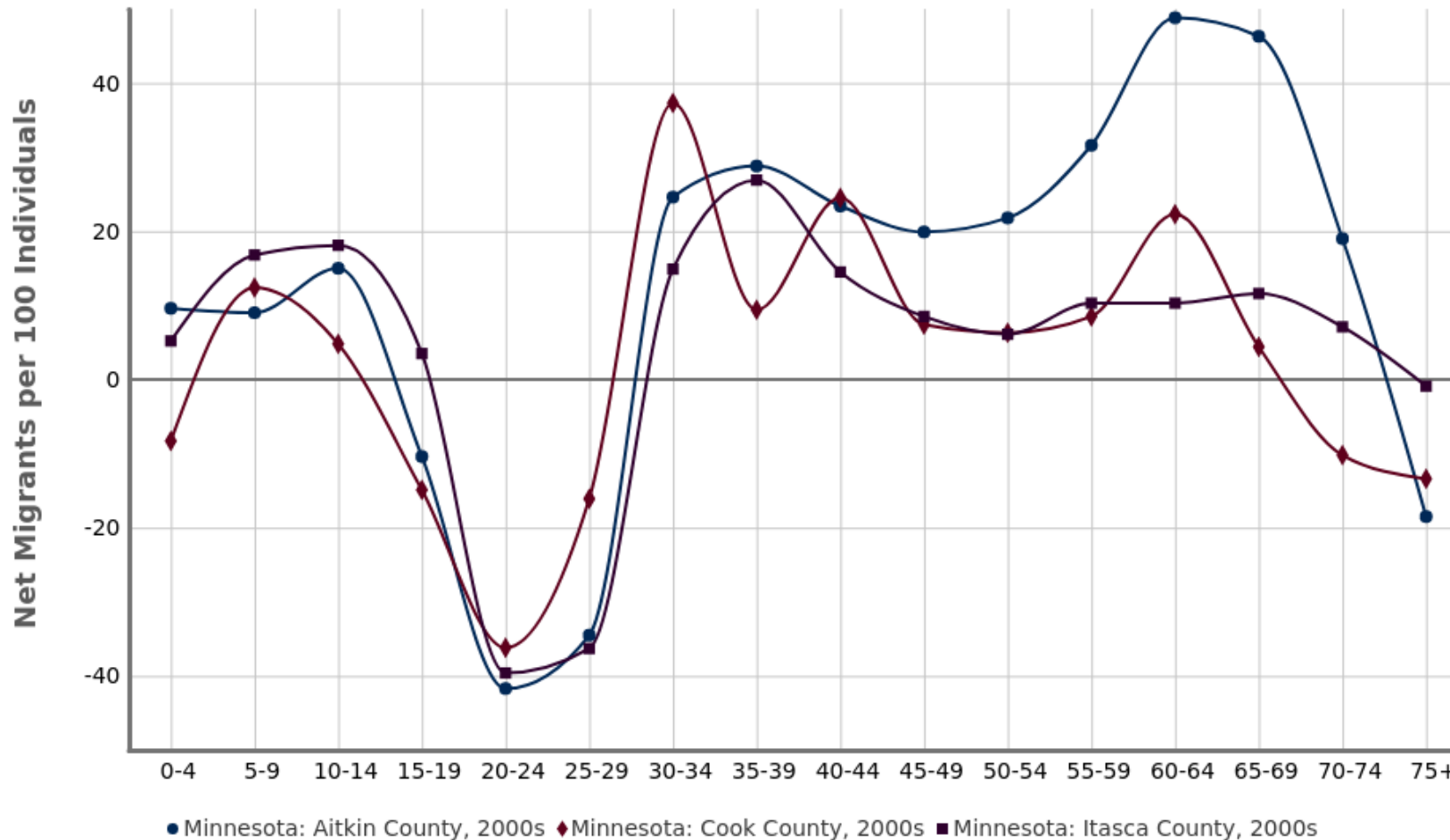
